

First Steps

- Initial setup
 - Supported browser
 - IE 8 or 9
 - Firefox 4.x through 13.x
 - Chrome 13 or later
 - Disable pop-up blocker and trust the TRITON manager URL
 - Certificate warning message
 - Enter subscription key
 - Websense Master Database starts downloading
 - Enables security features
 - Do not make configuration changes until the Master Database download completes

Integrating Websense

- TRITON Unified Security Center
 - Where Websense administration accounts reside
- TRITON Web Security
 - Settings tab
 - Main tab

- Configure secondary Policy Servers
 - Every Policy Server instance needs configuring
- Span traffic to Network Agent
 - You must mirror the bi-directional traffic (leaving your network) to Network Agent
- Configure third-party integration product
 - You must configure your firewall, proxy, or router to send lookup requests to Filtering Service
- Websense should now be fully functional--protecting your users and network

Filtering Hierarchy

- Websense Filters Web requests in a predictable order
- For each Web request, Websense determines if an "exception" or "policy" applies
 - 1. User
 - 2. Computer IP
 - 3. Network IP range
 - 4. Group
 - A user can be a member of multiple groups
 - 5. **Domain (OU)**
 - 6. **Default Policy**
 - Default Policy Applies when User, Computer, Network, Group, or Domain exception or policy does not match











Applying Policies

- Create a policy
- Create a category and protocol filters
- Apply the new policy to a client object(s)
- Verify correct filtering
 - View block page "more information" source code
